## World News

Welcome to the year of the horse (Chinese new year). With the new year comes more challenges. For instance, China is embracing new weapons and technology designed for space dominance. These new weapons include anti-satellite missiles [1]. What's more, there are concerns that China's military technology advances will surpass the US in as few as five years [2]. Meanwhile, China continues to upgrade its air force and Navy [3]. At a time of US cut backs, China's 2014 military spending will increase over \$10 billion [4].

With the enhanced Chinese military comes new expansion plans. Case in point, one report indicates China is planning to expand its air control zone to cover most of the South China Sea [5]. Last year, China launched 27 new surface combat ships consisting of 3 destroyers, 6 frigates, and 18 corvettes [6]. Meanwhile, the Philippines President Benigno S. Aquino III called on world leaders to help his country resist China's assertive South China Sea claims [7]. What's more, China's navy is reaching far beyond the South China Sea. For example, three Chinese ships, consisting of two destroyers and an amphibious landing ship, conducted exercises in the Indian Ocean [8].

When it comes to treaties, the US often looks the other way when cheating is detected. Case in point, the US is now claiming that Russia has been violating a treaty since 2008 that bans specific ground launched missile tests [9]. Of course, Russia is aware of the threat that China presents and is taking measures to protect itself from another boarder war with the Asian giant.

In the Middle-East, by one estimate, Iran now has the ability to build atomic bombs and a missile system to deliver the weapon [10]. What's more, Iran is moving several warships close to the US maritime boarder [11]. This effectively places the East coast of the US at risk from an Iranian attack. Iran is not the only direct threat to the US. For example, US citizens fighting in Syria are exposed to terrorist recruiters and could wreak havoc when they return home [12].

#### **Terrorism**

nce again, China finds itself battling terrorism. In the latest example, at least 12 people were killed in Xinjiang, home to the Muslim Uighur minority [1].

China is not the only nation to worry about terrorism. For instance, terrorists are warning they plan to use chemical weapons to strike the Sochi Winter Olympics [2].

Meanwhile, the Middle-East continues to be a hot bed of terrorism. Since the US withdrew from Iraq, the vacuum left is being filled by al-Qaeda terrorists [3]. For instance, in Baghdad, six suicide bombers killed at least 24 people in an attack on a government buildings [4]. Then more bombings killed another 32 people in Baghdad [5]. Meanwhile, the number of people killed in Iraq during January exceeded 1000 [6]. What's more, by one estimate, there are now 7,000 foreign Jihadists fighting in Syria [7]. Another report indicates al-Qaeda terrorists are also gaining a foothold in Lebanon [8]. Then there are indications that terrorism is taking root in Egypt [9].

We often think of Iranian sponsored terrorist organizations as limited to the Middle East. However, the Iranian proxy terrorist group, Hezbollah, is actively involved with money laundering, counter-

feiting, piracy, and drug trafficking with criminal groups in Latin America [10]. Additionally, some believe the sniper attack on California power transformers last April may have been a dry run for a terrorist attack [11].

It is difficult to believe we are serious about stopping terrorists from entering into the US with our Southern border unsecure. For instance, it appears that as drug gangs use high powered weapons to kill US agents, we respond by firing bean bags at them [12]. Hopefully, we will eventually secure our Southern border.

### **Economy**

For the week ending January 25, the number of first time unemployment claims was 348,000 [1]. Then for the week ending February 1, the number of claims was 331,000 [2].

While reports from the Department of Labor would have us believe everything is rosy, other signs indicate otherwise. Case in point, nearly half of working Americans are living pay check to pay check and 56% now have sub-prime credit ratings [3].

Meanwhile regulators continued closing banks. On January 31, the Syringa Bank of Idaho became the third financial institution shuttered this year [4].

The US continues to export jobs at a breathtaking pace. For instance, the trade deficit for December was reported by the Commerce Department at \$38.70 billion [5]. In particular, the deficit with China was \$24.5 billion [6].
