B ack when the Ukraine had nearly 2,000 nuclear weapons, the US, UK, and Russia agreed to protect the Ukrainian border in exchange for giving up its nuclear weapons [1]. In the most recent turn of events along the Russia/Ukraine border, a Malaysian 777 appears to have been shot down [2]. Indications are it was shot down by an SA-11 radar guided mobile air defense system capable of reaching aircraft flying at 80,000 feet [3]. Then two Ukrainian fighter jets were shot down [4]. So once again, Russia teaches us the need for a strong nuclear weapons capability. What's more, the US has backtracked on tough sanctions against Iran [5]. As a consequence, any sanctions against Russia will likely be difficult.

It has been over a month since the Malaysian flight 370 disappeared [6]. What is puzzling about this is the ready availability of public web sites that track every airplane in the air [7]. Moreover, one report indicates there was full satellite tracking of the Flight 17 aircraft of the same design that was shot down over the Ukraine [8]. The question here is how does a Boeing 777 plane disappear without notice?

The Middle-East continues to be a violent geographic area. After multiple rockets were launched by Hamas, Israel was forced to launched a ground invasion into the Gaza Strip [9].

Once again, as the world looks elsewhere, China continues to expand in the South China Sea. Case in point, as the US is trying to build its Littoral Combat Ship (LCS), China is deploying an anti-LCS referred to as the Type 056 corvette [10]. Meanwhile, China tested another missile designed to destroy satellites [11].

By one estimate, the total world Jewish population is approximately 13.75 million, with 43% residing in Israel [1]. Before the US sent forces into the first Gulf War, the Iraqi spokesperson, Tariq Aziz, was a Christian [5]. That is, Christianity was allowed in Iraq under the dictatorship of Saddam Hussein. During the second week of fighting, the death toll in fighting between Israel and the Hamas fighters in the Gaza Strip exceeded 700 [9]. However, this pales in comparison to the carnage ongoing in Syria. For example, approximately 700 people were killed in 2 days of fighting around Homs [10].

or the week ending July 12, the number of first time unemployment claims as reported by the Labor Department, was 302,000 [1]. Then for the following week, the number reported was 284,000 [2]. The improvement in fewer first time unemployment claims was partially offset by a weakening in the new home sales market. The new homes sales number reported by the Commerce Department was 8.1% lower for June and the previous number reported for May was revised lower [3].

The Eastside Commercial Bank in Georgia became the 13th bank shuttered by regulators this year [4]. Then on July 25, regulators closed the GreenChoice Bank in Illinois [5].
