World News

F ollowing last month's missile test to destroy satellites, China is turning space into the next battle ground [1]. Meanwhile, China continues to increase the number of nuclear and conventional warheads in its missile force [2]. Additionally, China conducted a second test of a new hypersonic glide missile that will expose the US to nuclear attack [3]. While China continues to build its military, the communist giant is also encroaching on its neighbors. Case in point, two Chinese survey ships were seen in the oil rich waters off the Philippines [4]. What's more, at least one Chinese fighter jet challenged a US military submarine watching aircraft [5]. Afterwards, China complained that US short-range reconnaissance missions jeopardized the safety of both countries [6].

Russia and the Ukraine crossed another threshold in the ongoing hostilities. Reports indicate that a Russian military column that entered Ukraine was destroyed by the Ukrainian military [7]. Following this, it appears the Russian rebels short down a Ukrainian fighter jet [8]. Then reports indicate Russia is firing artillery from inside the Ukrainian border [9]. At the same time, NATO is detecting large concentrations of Russian forces along the border with the Ukraine [10].

In Iraq, US airstrikes helped Kurdish fighters attempting to retake a dam recently captured by the Islamic State (IS) [11]. Indications are the largest dam located in Iraq has been retaken by Kurds from IS terrorists [12]. However the terrorist situation in Iraq is far from over. Case in point, even Pope Francis is backing the use of military action to protect Iraq minorities [13]. Separately, reports indicate the US may be planning to start bombing IS targets within Syria [14]. This is far different from the past threat of US action against the Syrian government for chemical weapons use against rebels [15].

Chinese hackers have been active during this news

period. This time a breach impacted an estimated 4.5 million members of a hospital network [2].

Finally, point of sale hacking is in the news. One report indicates over 1,000 businesses have been impacted by the "Backoff" malicious software (Malware) program that attacks devices such as cash registers [3].

Terrorism takes us back to ages we thought were long gone if we allow it a free hand to corrupt democratic societies and destroy the basic rules of international life.—Jacques Chirac The acts of terrorism from the Islamic State (IS) continue. For example, one report indicates in one minority Yazidi village, the IS executed 80 men and carried away hundreds of women [1].

Meanwhile, UK Prime Minister David Cameron is warning the IS could be a serious threat to the UK [2]. But perhaps the best indicator of the terrorism from IS comes directly from that organization. Case in point, they broadcast a tape showing the beheading of an American photo journalist [3].

One fear is the IS terrorist organization could hit targets in the US. According to Senator Inhofe, the IS terrorist organization is developing a capability to destroy an American city [4]. Concurrently, one piece suggests that Chicago is a prime target [5]. Another piece suggest Las Vegas is a top IS target [6].

Meanwhile, as open warfare continues between IS and other fractions, the random acts of terrorism continue throughout Iraq. Case in point, multiple bombs killed dozens of people in areas that are not in the war zone [7].

Economy

ccording to the Federal Reserve's No. 2 official, Stanley Fischer; reduced demand for American exports, reduced government spending, and an anemic housing market resulted in holding back a recovery [1]. It seems to us that these three items have a common root. Consider, as the US exports more jobs to China, fewer Americans can purchase a house. In turn, with fewer people employed, the tax base for Government spending is reduced. Moreover, China does not practice fair trade with other nations. Case in point, China fined Japanese auto parts companies for alleged price fixing [2]. This comes as the price of Chinese goods is increasing [3].

For the week ending August 9, the number of first time unemployment claims reported by the Labor Department was 311,000 [4]. Then for the following week, the number reported was 298,000 [5]. What's more, Federal Reserve Chair Janet Yellen warned the unemployment numbers overstate the health of the economy [6].

In a sign that high tech industry is still struggling; Cisco announced plans to lay off 6,000 workers [7]. This news comes after other tech leaders, including HP and Microsoft, announced planned layoffs [8].
