hina is using its newfound wealth to purchase high tech companies. For example, a Chinese investment group offered to by Integrated Silicon Solution Inc., a specialty memory chips manufacturing company, for \$639 million [1]. With the technology from purchased industries, China will be in a better position to enhance its military. One piece posits the question; is China modernizing its military or preparing for war [2].? For instance, China argues the need for artificial islands is in part because of the risk of typhoons in an area [3]. By one estimate, China has added 4 square kilometers of reclaimed land over the past few months [4]. One report suggests the island construction could result in de facto control of the South China Sea territory claimed by China [5]. This comes as satellite images of the Fiery Cross Reef shows a runway more than 500 meters and paved sections of apron [6]. Nevertheless, there are concerns the Chinese island reclamation has a military dimension [7]. Indeed, at a news conference, without going into detail, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Hua Chuny stated the artificial islands would meet China's military defense needs [8]. At the same time, China is complaining over resumption of construction on an island facility by the Philippines [9]. This would tend to support the argument that china is preparing for war.

Determining which terrorist organization will control Yemen continues to be a challenge. For example, al-Qaida fighters captured an oil terminal and major airport in South Yemen [10]. Meanwhile one report indicates Iran sent a destroyer and one other ship to the troubled Yemen waters [11]. What's more, Secretary of State Kerry expressed concern over Iran's support for the Shiite rebels in Yemen [12]. At this time, the US has seven warships near Yemen waters that could be used [13]. Iran's actions extend beyond Yemen. For instance, one report indicates the Nuclear framework deal with Iran does not address the Parchin military facility a key nuclear facility believed to have been used to develop nuclear weapons [14]. This suggests a final deal will be difficult to

ne report indicates bad actors are using drive by exploits to compromise targeted users instead of phishing attacks [1]. As long as sloppy code continues to permeate the market, such exploits will continue. One approach posited to improve code security is to litigate the software companies [2]. In the meantime, the race to fix security holes continues. For instance, the

latest Oracle patch includes 98 security fixes [3]. Then Microsoft's patch Tuesday included fixes for 26 vulnerabilities [4].

We often associated military security as the highest standard. However, there is an increasing risk, especially since back doors have been discovered in military chips [5]. Another threat comes from Foreign governments

penetrating US Government networks. Case in point, last October, it was discovered that White House and State Department networks were compromised for a number of months by Russian bad actors [6]. Additionally, bad actors infected FAA administrative computing systems earlier this year [7].
