World News

The wars in the Middle-East continue to expand. For instance, reports indicate the Iraqi city of Ramadi fell to Islamic State (IS) fighters [1]. Following this news, Iran-backed fighters were ordered to retake the city [2]. In yet another setback, it appears the IS seized the last Syrian government-controlled border crossing between Syria and Iraq [3]. Following this victory, reports indicate the IS captured the historic Syrian city Palmyra [4].

Then there is a report that the IS has solidified its foothold in Libya [5]. For instance, militias are actively fighting IS terrorists in the central city of Sirte [6]. One report indicates the IS has captured former Libyan leader Gaddafi's home town [7]. What's more, the Middle-East is moving towards a nuclear weapons armed hot spot. Case in point, one report indicates Saudi Arabia has made the decision to purchase nuclear weapons from Pakistan to counter the expected arsenal Iran is developing [8]

Meanwhile, the fighting in Yemen continues. One piece indicates Iran is sending additional fighters to the war torn country [9]. What's more, Saudi Arabian led airstrikes left at least 80 dead [10]. In other news, at least 4 Americans are believed to be captives of the Houthi rebels [11].

As China continues constructing artificial islands in the South China Sea, some countries are concerned over military aspects of the expansion. For instance, one report documents an encounter were a US aircraft was warned to leave the area by the Chinese in the area of a newly constructed island [12]. Additionally, there is a report China is jamming US military drones, as they near the newly created islands [13]. Then there is a report indicating China is constructing two lighthouses on reclaimed islands and is adding offensive military capabilities [14]. Finally, one piece indicates two Chinese motorized artillery pieces were seen on one of the artificial islands [15].

A ccording to IRS reports, hackers exploited the Get Transcript system, compromising approximately 100,000 taxpayer returns [1]. In response to the breach, the FBI has initiated an investigation into the matter [2]. Moreover, House lawmakers started questing IRS officials about the computer vulner-

abilities [3].

The cost of security breaches continues to rise. One study suggests the average cost associated with a data breach now stands at \$6.5 million [4].

Whenever power goes out and the utility company assets the exact cause is not know we have to wonder if there is more to the story. Case in point, north of Boston, 44,000 customers of the National Grid were without power and the root cause was under investigation [5].

ne report indicates Islamic State (IS) terrorists are being smuggled into Europe as part of the boat loads of immigrants fleeing war torn Libya [1]. In Malaysia, the IS continues expanding its reach as evidenced by the arrest of approximately 100 terrorists [2].

In Iraq, terrorist attacks continue. For instance, two bombings in Baghdad, near prominent hotels, killed at least 15 people [3].

Saudi Arabia is seeing an uptick of terrorism. For instance, a suicide bomber killed at least 10 people at a Shia mosque located in the Eastern Province [4]. In another instance, a car bomb exploded near a Shi'ite mosque in Dammam, killing at least 4

people [5]. The IS claimed responsibility for these latest bombings [6].

Economy

A ccording to the Labor Department, for the week ended May 16 the number of first time unemployment claims was 274,000 [1]. Then in the week ending May 23, the number increased to 282,000 [2].

While the US continues to struggle through a tough economic recovery, the same is not true for China. Case in point, one report indicates, on average, China is creating a new billionaire per week [3].

In more bad news, according to the Commerce Department, the US economy shrank by 0.7% during the first three months [4]. One report blames the staggering trade deficit for the economic downturn [5]. Another piece indicates economists at Goldman Sachs determined the change in the trade balance removed 1.9 percentage points off overall growth during the first quarter [6].

Consider, the prosperous Toyota City in Japan, home to 422,000 people and enriched by the auto industry [7]. In contrast, Detroit's bankruptcy problems continue to plague the once great city [8]. What's more, the 1960 Census listed Detroit as the 5th largest US

city with over 1.2 million residents [9]. By 2013, the estimated population fell below 690,000 [10]. Yet last year, Japanese car sales in China fell as US brand names increased [11]. This indicates that even today, Japan applies unfair trade practices on US auto imports. One needs to look no further than Detroit to see the consequences of allowing such practices.
