World News

Russia continues to expand its military around the world. For instance, one report indicates Russia wants to establish military bases in Viet Nam and Cuba [1]. This comes as Russia appears to be increasing its military capabilities in Syria [2]. Russia sent a pair of its top of the line TU-160 Blackjack bombers along Norway to Spain [3]. This, after a report Russia is preparing its citizen for possible nuclear war with the US [4]. What's more, one report indicates Russia added 61 more nuclear warheads to its inventory since April [5]. Another report indicates Russia has moved nuclear-capable missiles into its Kaliningrad outpost that borders NATO [6]. Then Russia announce it is suspending the US/Russia nuclear deal that was supposed to clean up weapons grade plutonium [7]. Moreover, Russia is moving additional advanced surface to air missiles into Syria [8]. Finally, according to the U.S. Strategic Command nominee; Russia and China are developing anti-satellite weapons [9].

Meanwhile, China's military warned Japan not to have joint patrols in contested waters [10]. Another sign of trouble ahead; Japan was forced to scramble fighter jets in response to eight Chinese military aircraft flying just outside of Japanese airspace [11]. This comes as one report suggests a nuclear war between China and Japan would result in Japan's extinction [12].

Yet again, another foreign sponsored cyber attach has breached a large company. This time, Yahoo was breached exposing 500 million user's personal information [1]. What's more, the breach continued for two years before it was detected [2]. One day after announcing the breach at Yahoo, a law suit was filed against the company for gross negligence [3].

On the race to fix security holes, Open SSL issued

patches to fix 14 vulnerabilities [4]. Then Google released patches to fix 78 vulnerabilities [5].

Whenever we see a train wreck, we are again drawn to the potential role of SCADA in the crash. The latest crash was a New Jersey Transit train that failed to stop at the Hoboken terminal, killing one person, injuring over 100, and causing extensive damage to the terminal [6]. As the train approached the termi-

nal at 8 miles per hour, the engineer blew the train's horn and activated the bell signaling the approach, then accelerated to 21 miles per hour, twice the authorized speed limit [7].

Once again, high speed AI driven programs were responsible for a flash crash. This time, British currency dropped 10% due to a flash crash, before recovering [8]. It is interesting to note that

A ccording to the Labor Department, for the week ending September 17, the number of first time unemployment claims was 252,000 [1]. Then for the following week, the number was 254,000 [2]. For the week ending October 1, the number reported was 249,000 [3].

Once again, regulators were forced to close a bank. The Allied Bank in Arkansas, became the fifth financial institution shuttered by regulators this year [4].

Meanwhile, the US continues to export wealth to China. Case in point, the US trade deficit for August rose to \$40.73 billion and the imbalance with China increased to \$33.85 billion [5]. In Europe, the EU determined China was unfairly subsidizing steel exports and imposed duties on the Chinese imports [6].
