World News

Indications are China has constructed reinforced hangers, capable of maintaining fighter aircraft, on contested islands located in the South China Sea [1]. Meanwhile, China is building up its naval presence around the Scarborough Shoal [2]. This is the same area where China has enforced a blockade since 2012 and is located only 123 miles from the Subic Bay naval port [3]. China also violated Japanese territorial claims around the Senkaku Islands; using hundreds of fishing vessels accompanied by 15 government ships [4]. One piece compares China's belligerent expansion to that of Imperial Japan before prior to World War II [5].

As China continues its military expansion, it is also developing Artificial Intelligence (AI) weapons. For instance, one piece describes AI controlled drones that autonomously select their own targets [6]. Moreover, Air Force Gen. Paul Selva, vice chair of the Joint Chiefs of Staff pointed out, our advisories will build autonomous weapons [7].

Meanwhile, there are reports of a 10-fold buildup of the Russian military near the Ukraine [8]. It is unclear if Russia is saber rattling or plans to annex more Ukrainian territory.

With new technology comes new risk. Case in point, researchers at the Def Con hacker convention demonstrated how to overwhelm Tesla's sophisticated car sensors to hit objects it otherwise wouldn't [1]. Furthermore, one report indicates tens of millions VW Group cars have keyless systems that can be hacked [2].

Whenever there is a major outage, we consider the likelihood that a security

failure was to blame. For instance, Delta Airlines reported a power outage was responsible for a global outage of their computing systems [3]. Hundreds of flights were canceled stranding thousands of passengers [4]. Then there was a two hour radar outage in Southern Florida, that affected 65 flights, and was also blamed on a power outage [5]. Elsewhere, the news media

A ccording to the Labor Department, for the week ending August 6, the number of first time unemployment claims was 266,000 [1]. Then for the week ending August 13, the number was 262,000 [2]. Finally, for the following week, the number reported was 261,000 [3].

In more bad financial news, the GDP increased at only a 1.1% rate for the second quarter [4]. That equates to a 0.275% actual growth.

In another sign of a weak economy, Macy's announced plans to close another 100 stores [5]. Additionally, Cisco announced plans to lay off 5,500 employees [6].

Meanwhile, regulators were again closing financial institutions. The Woodbury Banking Co., in Georgia was shuttered [7].
