World News

N orth Korea's successful conducted an underwater missile launch test and there are concerns the rogue nation will challenge the US in the near future [1]. Additionally, they fired three ballistic missiles with a 1,000 KM range toward the Sea of Japan [2]. Then, the communist country detonated its fifth nuclear device and claimed to have the technology to miniaturize nuclear warheads [3]. The latest explosion is the largest yet, estimated to equal 10 kilotons of TNT [4].

Meanwhile, China continues to challenge the Philippines over contested islands. Case in point, China is reported to have increased the number of ships operating in the Scarborough Shoal to include barges [5]. Some of the Chinese ships are thought to be dredges used for land reclamation [6]. What's more, Japan announced plans to join US patrols in the South China Sea [7].

Technology is the great enabler for military success. One technology of particular interest is scramjets, capable of air fueled hypersonic flight. India successfully tested a rocket assist version; however only the US and China have tested free-flying vehicles [8]. This comes after news emerged of China's DF-DZ hypersonic glide vehicle and the commitment to missile warfare with the US [9]. Additionally China successfully launched its second space station [10]. Moreover, China is militarizing their technology at a rapid pace. Case in point, Chinese General Ma Xiaotian indicated a new bomber is in development (referred to as the H-6K with an expected range of 6,000KM) [11].

I n another example of unfair trade, the Chinese government provides direct funding to develop its industry. For instance, China's state owned Aero-Engine Group received funds to develop aircraft engines in order to compete globally [1].
