World News

The war drums calling for a military response to North Korea are getting louder. One piece claims the Secretary of Defense, has informed the military to be prepared for North Korea [1]. This comes are news reports indicate the assassinated half-brother of the North Korean leader had 1.4 times the lethal dose of VX nerve agent on his face [2]. One piece points out the use of a banned chemical weapon is a sign of supreme confidence the North Korean leader can get away with any crime [3]. Meanwhile, North Korea's deputy U.N. ambassador is warning, nuclear war can break out at any moment [4]. Concurrently, South Korea's top diplomat issued a warning that North Korea is nearing nuclear weapons capability [5].

North Korea is not the only Asian threat. According to one piece, China has developed a military plan to invade Taiwan by 2020 [6]. This comes as China has reasserted it will not allow an independent Taiwan [7]. Moreover, China has started deploying its new J-20 stealth fighter [8]. One article indicates the J-20 is a long range, high speed aircraft designed to attack airborne support systems such as the AWACS and refueling aircraft [9].

The technology used in combat is rapidly evolving. For instance, one report indicates the Ukraine will deploy offensive robots by next year [10]. In the race for militarized robots, one piece suggests the US lags Russia in this area [11]. However, another article suggests the US will have more combat robots than people by as early as 2025 [12].

The war against the Islamic State (IS) is progressing. Case in point, one report indicates the former capital of IS, Raqqa, is fully under US backed forces control [1].

With the loss of territory, the IS attacks are dominated by insurgency tactics [2].

nce again, regulators were busy closing a financial institution; seven so far this year. The latest casualty was the Farmers and Merchants State Bank of Argonia, in Kansas [1].

According to the Commerce Department, the US trade deficit for August was \$42.4 billion [2]. For the week ending September 30, the number of first time unemployment claims reported by the Labor Department was 260,000 [3]. Then for the week ending October 7, the number of claims was 243,000 [4]. Finally, the number of first time unemployment claims fell to a 44 year low of 222,000 [5]. On October 17, the Dow Jones Industrial Average set a

new record high, crossing the

23,000 level [6]. Then on Oc-

tober 18, the Dow rose 160 points to close above 23,000 for the first time [7].
