World News

It seems out good friend China is actively trying to undermine Western powers. For instance, one piece indicates China has been helping Iran with its missile program [1]. This comes as one report suggests China is rapidly closing the military gap with the US [2]. One piece suggests the new Chinese airborne early warning aircraft indicates China is planning six or more aircraft carriers [3]. Finally, China appears to have constructed South China Sea island facilities to house long range surface to air missiles [4].

Meanwhile, North Korea conducted a ballistic missile test [5]. However, a more immediate concern; all indications point to North Korea as the source for a VX nerve agent used as an assassination weapon in Malaysia's main international airport [6]. VX is considered a weapon of mass destruction by the UN and a 10 milligram dose on the skin can be fatal [7]. Two women being held for the attack said they believed they were part of a prank to smear a baby oil substance on the target [8]. It remains unclear how the women were protected against the agent during and after the attack. That North Korea would use such a weapon in an international airport indicates a new capability and willingness to use such weapons. Meanwhile, China is blaming the U.S. for tensions with North Korea [9].

In the Middle-East, the wars in Syria and Iraq continue. In Mosul, Iraq, Islamic State (IS) fighters are using car bombs, snipers and armed drones [10]. On the U.S. coalition side, the previous strict rules of engagement have been relaxed allowing faster access to firepower [11]. And for the first time, the Iraqi Air Force stuck IS targets inside Syria [12]. One piece suggests American troops in Syria may be part of the request to defeat the IS [13].
