The U.S. has released \$6 Billion for Iran in exchange for 5 hostages [1]. This should free up funds for other Iranian activities. Iran is also exporting more oil, thereby increasing its cash flow [2]. It is suspected that Iran already has the materials for constructing nuclear weapons [3]. Meanwhile, the Saudi Crown Prince warned that if Iran gets nuclear weapons, his country would have get weapons of their own [4].

The Air Force Secretary Frank Kendall, claimed China is preparing its military for war with the United States [5]. Meanwhile, China continues to apply military pressure against Taiwan. For example, 40 PRC warplanes entered Taiwan's air defense zone [6]. In response to the growing threat from China, Taiwan continues to build its military. For instance, the island nation unveiled its first domestically-made diesel-electric submarine [7].

The open US Southern border continues to see record numbers of illegal crossings. Case in point, for the month of September, over 260,000 illegal crossing took place [8].

By September 21, the Ukrainian armor finally broke through the Russian lines in one small area [9]. It seems, the Ukrainian forces must now cover a large open ground before reaching a nearby village

[10]. This suggests the counteroffensive is not going as planned.


Meanwhile, the United Auto Workers union is on strike against Ford, GM, and Stellantis [3]. During the strike, President Biden joined the picket line [4].
