World News

I ranian proxies continue to target US forces. For example, the guided missile destroyer USS Thomas Hudner shot down an incoming drone fired from Yemen [1]. Attacks continued into a second week with no damage to the US ship [2]. Then, two ballistic missiles were fired by Houthi controlled areas in Yemen and landed approximately 10 miles from US destroyers [3]. Iran-backed militants launched a ballistic missile attack from a truck against U.S. forces at al-Asad Airbase in western Iraq and the US military attack the truck that fired the missile [4]. Since the war started, there have been at least 74 attacks on US forces in the Middle-East [5]. Additionally, Iran continues to enrich Uranium above the United Nations limit previously agreed upon [6]. Meanwhile, the US has extended a waiver by four months that allows Iraq to purchase electricity from Iran and generate an estimated \$10 Billion [7].

The Israel war is having an impact on the Ukraine war. For example, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy warned the number of 155 mm artillery shells is getting dangerously low [8]. Additionally, Russia launched 75 drones against Ukraine's capital of Kyiv [9]. In a sign of continued trouble, the Ukrainian President warned the war this winter will be difficult [10]. What's more, the Russian mercenary group, Wagner, may be preparing to provide Iran or Hezbollah with an air defense capability [11].

China continues to exert it military power. Case in point, a Chinese destroyer used its sonar to injure two Australian divers working on the HMAS Toowoomba [12]. (Continued on page 2)

Israel War

The propaganda war continues to tilt against Israel. Case in point, Turkish leader Erdogan called Israel a terrorist state [1]. Meanwhile, the impact to Gaza includes nearly 100,000 buildings damaged [2]. One report indicates Israel knew of the attack plan a year in advance [3]. Such reports will pressure the Israel leadership as the war progresses.

The war continues to expand. For example, the Damascus airport in Syria was bombed an put out of operation [4]. Hezbollah

forces attacked several Israel army posts along the Lebanon border [5].

This comes as the US gets directly involved with the war planning. Case in point, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken provided the Israel war cabinet a timeline and ways to minimize collateral damage [6]. Concurrent with the war are continued acts of terrorism. For example, Hamas terrorists killed three people at a bus stop in Jerusalem [7].


Economy
