# World News

In the Sudan, war is causing foreigners to flee the country [1]. Meanwhile, the US is evacuating American citizens still in country [2]. On a positive note, the warring parties are meeting for face-to-face negotiations [3].

Iranian forces seized a U.S.-bound oil tanker in the Gulf of Oman [4]. Then, Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard seized a Panamanian-flagged oil tanker in the Strait of Hormuz [5]. This comes as estimates indicate Iran has enough Uranium to construct 5 nuclear weapons [6].

The World Health Organization has declared an end to the COVID-19 emergency [7]. In the US, the COVID-19 emergency expires on May 11 [8]. Consequently, COVID-19 requirements for travelers will be lifted on May 11 [9]. The JHU Coronavirus Resource Center stopped recording COVID-19 related US deaths on March 10, when the number dead was 1,123,836 [10].

Regarding the origin of COVID-19, a US Senate report indicates two separate lab leaks may have been the source of the virus [11]. Moreover, it appears the US funded gain of function research at the Wuhan Institute of Virology prior to the COVID-19 outbreak [12]. Concurrently, another research paper suggested the origin was racoon dogs located at the wet market in Wuhan, China [13]. However, this finding was contradicted by researchers that examined the source data [14].

# Ukraine War

fter Russia invaded the Ukraine, President Biden imposed economic sanctions against Russia [1]. Now well into the second year of conflict, it appears the sanctions are being bypassed. Case in point, it appears that China and India are purchasing Russian oil and selling it to the West [2]. So, Russia continues to sell its oil while the West pays for it by enriching China and India.

The use of drones is a factor in the conflict. For instance, a Ukrainian drone strike hit a fuel storage facility in the Crimean port of Sevastopol [3]. In another example, Russia has accused the Ukraine of using two drones in a failed attack on the Kremlin [4]. Russia has declared the attack an assassination attempt targeting their President Vladimir Putin [5]. In response, Ukraine officials deny they claim [6]. In sum-

mary, the drone attacks have ratchetted up the war [7].

## **Economy**

he US banking sector continues along a rocky road. For instance, last month, the First Republic Bank survived when 11 banks deposited \$30 billion into troubled financial institution [1]. Now, the bank reported it lost 40% of deposits during the first quarter and its stock was under renewed pressure [2]. Then the First Republic bank was seized by regulators and taken over by IP Morgan [3]. This is the third large bank (after Silicon Valley Bank and Signature) to fail in under two months [4].

The Commerce Department reported the US trade deficit for March was \$84.6 billion [5]. The Commerce Department also reported the Gross Domestic Product for the first quarter was at a rate of 1.1% [6]. In contrast, China's rate of increase was 4.5% [7].

Meanwhile the Federal Reserve increased interest rates by 0.25% [8]. Finally, the unemployment rate for April was 3.4% [9].
