In the world of chemical explosives, one of the most powerful is China Lake compound number 20, referred to as CL-20 [1]. The US defense contractor, Northrup Grumman, currently manufactures an estimated 10,000 – 20,000 pounds of CL-20 per year [2]. However, China has developed a method to improve safety, allowing it to mass produce the explosive [3]. Thus, even though the US discovered the explosive, China is out producing us.

One report indicates classified Chinese military research was conducted in Wuhan to make bat viruses infectious to humans, just prior to COVID-19 [4]. Another report indicates the first people to contract COVID-19 were conducting research on novel coronaviruses at the Wuhan Institute of Virology [5]. For example, Ben Hu, who led WIV's gain-of-function research on coronaviruses, was among the "patients zero" [6]. This new information suggests China has been deceiving the West of the origins of the virus.

Every once in a while, mother nature provides a teachable moment. Case in point, wildfires in Canada were responsible for an air quality disaster for the North East US [7]. So, for all the green environmental controls, we have no protection against events in another country. A pproximately 25 drones attacked the Russia capital, Moscow, hitting several buildings [1]. Drones were also used to attack Russian oil facilities located in two border towns [2]. Then, a drone hit a residential building located in southwestern Russia [3].

Meanwhile, one report indicates Russian forces blew up a dam [4]. The destruction triggered an emergency and destroyed a hydroelectric generating

station [5]. The dammed water was used to cool nuclear power sites that have since were shut down [6]. One report suggests at least 16 deaths are due to the flooding [7].

Meanwhile the war entered a new deadly phase. One report indicates nuclear weapons have been positioned inside Belarus [8]. President Putin warned the nuclear weapons would be used to prevent a strategic defeat in the Ukraine [9]. What's more, President Putin advisor, Professor Karaganov, is warning that a nuclear first strike must be a viable option [10]. This comes as President Biden is receptive to a plan to get Ukraine included within NATO [11]. Finally, the much anticipated, Ukraine counter-offensive has begun [12].
