World News

N orth Korea tested another intercontinental ballistic missile that was airborne for 74 minutes [1]. The significance, it could hit a target anywhere on Earth. The north is also threatening a nuclear first strike in protest to an American submarine visit to South Korea [2]. For its part, South Korea is developing a 3,000 KM range ballistic missile that carries a 8 ton warhead [3]. While the missile is supposed to be conventional, it has the capacity to carry nuclear warheads. Meanwhile, China is constructing a new type 054B frigates that is larger than its replacement [4].

During the 17th century, the world experienced a little ice age. Science has suggested the cause was due to low sunspot activity [5]. Since the beginning of July through the second week, sunspot activity has been unusually extreme [6,7]. Concurrently, record temperatures were seen on the North American, European, and Asian contents [8]. Some have blamed Climate change and El Niño for the record temperatures [9]. The question here is how much is the unusually active sun contributing to temperature increases?

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The war moved closer to toward nuclear conflict. Case in point, the Wagner Group, during its failed coup attempt, tried to secure backpack sized nuclear devices [1]. Had they been successful, they might have been able to start a nuclear war all by themselves.

Meanwhile, following an attack on the bridge connecting the Crimea with Russia, Russian forces launched drone attacks against the Ukrainian port city of Odessa [2]. Additionally, Ukrainian forces de-

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stroyed an ammunition depot located in Russian occupied Crimea [3].

The cost of the war is slowly wearing down Ukrainian forces. For instance, on average the Ukrainian forces are losing 4-5 people for a few hundred feet of gain [4].

The war continues to include targets within Russia. For instance, Russia claims it shot down a Ukrainian missile over the city of Taganrog [5]. Separately, there are reports of a large explosion in the city's center [6]. Them at least one drone struck a non-residential office building in Moscow [7].

The cost of the war is helping some countries. For example, North Korea is selling poor quality missiles to the Ukraine [8].

Another report indicates around 100 Wagner Group mercenaries were seen moving toward the Polish border [9]. There is fear they could pose as migrants and slip across the border into Poland [10].


Economy
