China continues to make news. For instance, in California, an illicit Chinese biolab was discovered [1]. Then there are indications China is constructing an airstrip in the South China Sea on Triton Island which is located in the Paracels [2]. Meanwhile China continues to expand its nuclear weapons capabilities. Case in point, the communist giant is on track to have silos to support 320 multi-warhead missiles [3].

Ukraine War

The Ukraine counter offensive is slowing down. For instance, some soldiers are describing Russians as tougher than expected [1].

On the other side, at least one Russian warship was seen lisping following a drone strike [2]. The next day, another sea drone struck a Russian tanker [3]. Additionally, all major airports in Moscow were briefly closed during a drone attack [4].

Back in 2022, President Biden asserted that sending fighters to the Ukraine would result in World War 3 [5]. Now, the President has reversed himself and has allowed F-16 fighters to be sent to the Ukraine [6]. Given the threat of a nuclear world war, the question here is; what has changed since 2022?

In Pakistan, a suicide bomber attacked an Islamic political convention, killing at least 44 people [1]. In Yemen, an Al-Qaeda attack killed four people including a secessionist commander [2]. In Syria, and ISIS attack on soldiers killed at least 20 people [3]. In Niger, 17 soldiers were killed in an ambush by insurgents [4].

Within the US terrorism remains a concern. For example, in Philadelphia, a 17-year-old ISIS inspired man was arrested by the FBI for supporting the terrorist organization [5]. One driver for terrorism ap-


Economy
