World News

There are some indications that Russia may be willing to discuss peace [1]. Additionally, Russia may now be using North Korean short range ballistic missiles against the Ukraine [2]. Another piece indicates North Korea will provide Russia with new types of tactical guided missiles [3]. This comes as Russia and India discuss increased trade and mutual development of weapons [4]. Meanwhile, Russian forces continue to escalate attacks. For instance,122 missiles were fired killing at least 18 people [5]. In a January 7 attack, Ukraine was only able to shoot down on 18 out of the 59 missiles launched [6].

After three US service members were wounded, President Biden order retaliatory strikes against select Iranian-backed militia groups [7]. Meanwhile the US Navy sank three small boats belonging to Houthi rebels that were attacking a commercial ship in the Red Sea [8]. Off the Gulf of Oman, Iran seized an oil tanker [9]. The U.S. and UK struck multiple Houthi targets in Yemen [10]. Additional allied strikes were launched against another site during the second day [11].

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Israel War

he war continues to expand. Israel Defense Force (IDF) warplanes conducted airstrikes against Hezbollah targets in Lebanon [1]. In the Red Sea a cargo ship was attacked by Yemen's Iran-backed Houthi rebels [2]. The ship hit was later identified as the Swiss-based Mediterranean Shipping Co. (MSC) container ship, the MSC United VIII [3]. On December 30, a missile fired from Houthi-controlled Yemen hit the Dutch-owner container ship, Maersk Hangzhou [4]. As a consequence,

the Maersk shipping company has paused shipping through the Red Sea [5].

The expanded war has also spilled over into northern regions. For example, the IDF struck targets in Lebanon [6]. Then, Israel was accused of using a drone strike for the assassination of senior Hamas leader Saleh Arouri in Lebanon [7].

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Terrorism

It seems that Iran is claiming credit for some of the October 7 terror attack launched by Hamas against Israel [1]. Meanwhile, at least 73 people were killed as a result of twin bomb explosions near the tomb of Iranian general Qasem Soleimani [2]. Later, the Islamic State claimed responsibility for the attack [3].

Elsewhere, religious based terrorism continues. For example, in Africa, approximately 200 Christians were murdered for sport [4]. In Pakistan, a roadside bomb detonated killing at least 6 police
