World News

China continues to expand its military options for the conquest of Taiwan. Case in point, the communist giant has researched a conventional hydrogen-based bomb that causes extensive thermal damage [1]. This comes as the new chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, General Dan Caine, warned the US lacks the ability to deter China [2].

In Iran, a massive explosion at the port of Bandar Abbas, killed at least 14 people [3]. The explosion occurred in an area tied to a charity overseen by Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei's office [4].

North Korea has confirmed it has deployed troops to Russia [5]. Additionally, the two countries are also constructing an interconnecting bridge [6]. Separately, the North Korean leader observed the launch of short range ballistic missiles that impacted in the area between the Korean Peninsula and Japan [7].

On May 7, India launched attacks on Pakistan in response to a terrorist attack in the Kasmir [8]. One report suggests Pakistan's Karachi Port was damaged during an Indian attack [9]. Another report indicates two Indian warplanes were shot down by Chinese made Pakistani aircraft [10]. Meanwhile, India accused Pakistan of using drones to attack three bases [11]. The fighting included exchange of artillery fire [12]. On May 10, Pakistan accused India of attacking its military bases [13]. Finally, President Trump announced a cease fire between the India and Pakistan [14].

he US attacks on Yemen continued. For example, attacks on the capital killed at least 12 people [1]. This comes as a Houthi launched ballistic missile was intercepted over the Israel city of Haifa [2]. On May 4, the Houthis used a ballistic missile that struck near Ben-Gurion Airport [3]. They later announced an aerial blockade around Israel airspace [4]. In response, Israel forces dropped around 50 munitions on terror targets in Yemen [5]. Then Israel struck the airport in Yem-

en's Houthi-controlled capital Sanaa causing an estimate \$500 million in damage [6].

The USS Harry S Truman lost an F/A-18E Super Hornet fighter jet [7]. On May 6, the same aircraft carrier lost a second F/A 18E aircraft [8]. Finally, Oman medicated a ceasefire between the US and Yemen [9].

On April 27, Israeli forces struck Hezbollah targets located in Beirut [10]. Later, Israel conducted strikes in Southern Lebanon [11].
