## World News

There are a number of questions regarding ship safety. For example, in New York City, a Mexican warship crashed into the Brooklyn Bridge, Killing at least 2 people [1]. In Norway, a container ship run aground, nearly hitting a man's house [2].

Meanwhile, the war between Russia and the Ukraine continues. Reports indicate a massive Missile and drone attack against the city of Kyiv [3]. This was followed by a second night of attacks on the capital city [4]. On the third night, Russia struck targets in the city of Odessa [5]. Just before resuming the peace talks, Russia launched fresh attacks into the Ukraine [6]. In spite of the attack, Russia and the Ukraine exchanged hundreds of prisoners [7].

This comes as North Korea has provided Russia with 14,000 troops and 100 ballistic missiles [8]. In return, Russia is helping North Lorea's military including missile improvements [9].

In Southeast Asia, Thai and Cambodian troops exchanged fire, killing one person [10]. The two sides have agreed to negotiate on the border issue [11].
